Special announcement from Fr. David


Blessings to all of you. I cannot thank you enough for your prayers. Unfortunately, I don't have much to update regarding my health condition. So don't stop praying!

Lenten Book Study - Rachel Held Evans' "Inspired"

- To enhance the bonds that make us one Body in Christ by sharing and studying together;
- To provide a poignant guide to assist us in naming and claiming our stories;
- To better discern our roles as disciples as shaped by the intersection of biblical stories and our own.

In addition to the study guide, video reflections will accompany each week's reading. It begins March 3!




